JCSA-CALICUT: A BRIEF REPORT

Kerala Province, and particularly Christ Hall, was privileged to welcome Fr Lisbert D' Souza and all the members of the JCSA, 24 in all, who had their meeting from 7–13 March 2010. The last JCSA Meet to be held in the Province was at Pariyaram way back in the early 1990s. The meeting began with a Sunday Eucharist at 6.00 p.m. After the preliminary session all were warmly welcomed at Supper by the Superior of Christ Hall. All the Jesuits of Calicut region joined the function. A short video presentation prepared by Schs. Sooraj and Sajit

on Kerala Province was screened for the guests followed by a grand Dinner. Fr Joe Pulickal guided the JCSA through a "Day with the Lord" on the theme of "Governance at the service of Mission." Apart from the usual proceedings there were input sessions by Fr Xavier Alphonse (MDU), member UGC on higher education. Fr Charles Lasrado, Convener of COJET, enlightened them on Financial Management and related matters. A mid-week Break on 11 March provided a welcome break from the sweltering heat of Calicut. They went to enjoy the cooler weather of Wayanad and the hospitality of the Jesuits of Sarvodaya School, Eachome. The Sarvodaya Jesuit Community went out of its way to make the Major Superiors feel at home. Frs. Lisbert D' Souza and Edward Mudavassery planted two saplings in the campus of Sarvodaya School. In the afternoon, the JCSA team was introduced to the activities of TUDI. The inmates of the Centre put up an hour-long cultural programme that expressed their love, culture, life and aspirations. Even the visitors were tapping their feet to the loud drum beats and the catchy tribal tunes. Fr Lisbert in his concluding remarks encouraged the performers to always carry their culture wherever they go and whatever they do. Bishop Joseph Kalathiparambil was invited for tea and Fr Provincial introduced the members of JCSA to the Bishop. The Bishop in turn invited the members of JCSA for dinner at the Bishop's House on the penultimate day of the JCSA Meet. During the week they visited the renovated *Matri Dei* Cathedral and dined with the Jesuit community at St Joseph's, Calicut. The two floors of the newly constructed Provincial residence were fully ready for the smooth conduct of the meet. Hats off to Fr Kallepallil, the Provincial, Frs. V.T Jose, Dominic, E. P. Mathew, Pious, Baby Mullo, Mathew Pullattu, the scholastics and the domestic staff who were ever ready to serve the JCSA members! The rare cuisine with Kerala specials was a treat indeed. They look forward to the next chance.

FR ZUCOL—A RARE SAPTATI !

On Sunday March 14 Mariapuram became the venue of a rarest of rare kind of celebration, namely, the Sacerdotal “Saptati” of Fr Zucol who is 95 and still active! Seventy years of priesthood is surely a very rare grace; in Fr Zucol’s case, these seventy years have been consistently active in a superlative degree, and, also, richly fruitful.

Fr Zucol must have baptized (or received into the Church) five to six thousand people; he founded and established around 20 parishes (people with their homes and other facilities, well-built churches with priests’ residences, convents), with average 100–150 families. For the converts and others (including non-Christians) he has built or helped build over 9000 houses, dug or helped to dig thousands of wells, distributed thousands of sewing machines and domestic animals, given crores of rupees to medical and other kinds of helps.

What Fr Zucol takes pride in and never tires of repeating, however, is his having celebrated over 25000 Masses, hardly ever missing one. He also remembers with gratitude and joy the realization of his Big Dreams in the foundation of the Deena Sevana Sabha, the Devamatha Ashram (of the contemplative Rosarians) and the Ignatian Retreat Centre (for ongoing faith formation).

Neither the Province nor the Diocese has the precedence of such a celebration, and so it was hardly a month prior to the actual date (March 9) that we suddenly realized that it should not pass uncelebrated. With the Bishop enthusiastically supporting the idea, it was thought practical to call together representatives of the parishes established by Fr Zucol to plan the celebration. And so, we decided upon a three tier celebration—Mass of Thanksgiving on 9 March in all the parishes, inviting Fr Zucol to all these parishes for a celebratory Mass, and, also a diocesan level celebration on the Sunday following 9 March. As for the expenses,

it was decided to take a pre-announced special Sunday Collection in all the above mentioned parishes, to be supplemented, if need be, by the Diocese.

As it turned out, however, people contributed so generously that, after meeting the expenses of nearly Rs 100,000 the Celebration Committee could present to the Bishop a balance of Rs 70,000 for priestly formation.

What was most remarkable was the actual participation of the people. Whereas we had expected maximum 2000 people, over 4000 braved the distances and the summer sun and remained till the end. It looked as though people had been just waiting for an opportunity to demonstrate their love, gratitude and esteem for their father and mentor in faith.

For the Society’s part, Fr Provincial as well as the POSA, Fr Edward Mudavassery concelebrated the solemn Eucharist with Fr Zucol (alongside the Bishop), felicitated Fr Zucol at the public meeting following the Mass and shared the common agape.

REPORT ON PASTORAL MINISTRY

FROM TAIWAN

HAPPY EASTER to one and all! It is Holy Thursday afternoon. This morning, after a lapse of 6 years, I participated in the CHRISM MASS. It was presided over by His Grace, John Hung Shan-Chuan

S.V.D., Archbishop of Taipei. We were around 150 Priests concelebrating with him. Along with an accomplished choir of adults, we sang with gusto the Kyrie and then the Latin Gloria, Sanctus, Agnus Dei in the good old Gregorian Chant! During his homily, the Archbishop referred to the crisis in the Church in Ireland and in Germany which has affected the whole Church, including our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI. He exhorted us to pray specially for the grace of priestly purification and renewal. After the Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service, one by one we approached the Archbishop and he gave each one of us a brotherly "amplexus". After the Church Service, we walked to a nearby Restaurant for a 10-course Chinese Banquet. The Archbishop went from table to table (Chinese prefer round tables), greeting all the Priests. As if that was not enough, he stood at the entrance at the end of the meal and thanked each one of us for accepting his invitation and gracing the occasion. There will be 7 Adult Baptisms in Fu Jen Catholic University Chapel and more in many Parishes in Taiwan during the Easter Vigil, but these are nothing compared to the number of Adult Baptisms in Singapore. All the other subjects here are taught Chinese.

KURUVILA CHERIAN
Nalpathamkalam (1941– 2010)

Fr Kuruvila Cherian's untimely death on 6 March 2010, before he was quite 69, far away from home, in Guyana, should be saddening to everyone who knew him.

In late February this year he suffered a mild stroke. He was treated in a hospital in Georgetown, the capital of Guyana. His condition improved. On March 5 he was discharged from the hospital and taken to the Jesuit house in the city. That day passed off well, but Kuruvila was restless in the night. In the morning he sat up on the bed, spoke, but looked dazed and sleepy. At about 10.20 he fainted. He was rushed to the hospital while a qualified nurse was giving him heart massage. After about half an hour in the emergency care room Dr. Kumar who attended on him announced that Fr Kuruvila had passed away. The Regional Superior of Guyana, Fr Dermot Preston wrote: "The final collapse could have been triggered by a number of fragilities in Kuru's system... the heart or the breathing ...the still high sugar level despite the insulin injections." The funeral was to be on March 15, in St Francis Xavier's Church cemetery in Port Mourant, Berbice, where Kuruvila was working laSt

Kuruvila was born on 18 July 1941, to Cherian and Mariamma, the 6th of their 11 children, in Changanacherry. Sri Cherian was a magistrate in the state of Travancore. That required the family to be on the move often. And so Kuruvila grew up with the experience of shifting home often and having his schooling in different places.

After pre-university studies, he joined the Society in June 1958, at Beschi College, Dindigul. He did philosophy in Shembaganur, reGENCY in Loyola School, Trivandrum, graduate studies in Chemistry in Chennai, post-graduate studies in Chemistry at Trichy, B. Ed. in Trivandrum, and theology in Pune. He was ordained in April 1974, in Changanacherry. He was assigned to Loyola school. In 1977 he was sent to do the Tertianship in Hazaribag. He made

the Final Commitment in the Society in Loyola School in August 1978.

Kuruville was again assigned to Loyola School. During 1982–1984 he did a Master's degree in Loyola, Mary Mount, Los Angeles, USA. Then he returned to Loyola. During these two stints at Loyola, Kuruville handled, simultaneously or at different times, the responsibilities of the Vice Principal of the school, Director of the boarding, and Minister of the Jesuit community. He played an important role in the building of the hockey ground, improving the facilities in the boarding, and acquiring a fleet of buses for the day scholars of the school.

In 1986 he was assigned to AKJM School, Kanjirapally, to be the Principal. He held that job till 1998. In 1998 Fr Kuruville was brought back to Loyola School as Principal. Dreaming big for Loyola he started improving the infrastructure of the campus: put up the fence around the football ground, fixed collapsible gates at all entrances to the school, started the construction of the new Junior School (the present CBSE Block), expanded the computer lab and did the spade work for the indoor stadium (which has been completed magnificently lately). Was Kuruville attempting too much too fast? The school exam results showed a slight decline. He had difficulty in convincing his superiors about the relevance of his big projects for the school. In this context Fr Kuruville left Loyola and the Province in 2000, rather abruptly to the surprise of all.

First he went to Nepal and worked in the Jesuit Refugee Service. Then in 2002 he moved to Africa and served in the Jesuit Refugee Service for some time and then taught in St Augustine's University, Tanzania. In 2003 he went to Guyana. He continued to serve in the field of education even in Guyana. He was Lecturer in Education in the Berbice Campus of the University of Guyana and became the first Director of the Guyana Human Development Centre in Miss Phoebe. He was appointed Superior of the

Pakaraimas & Ru-pununi Jesuit community from 2006-2009 and then finally was a member of the Jesuit team for Pastoral Ministry in Corentyne.

What kind of a person was Kuruville? Mr Sanish Mathew who passed out of AKJM in 1989 recalls: Fr Kuruville introduced "pants and shirt as the uniform of the students, wrote the new school anthem, started training programs in computer, music, cricket, basketball, the martial arts, arranged special classes for the weak and free classes for the poor, implemented various revolutionary changes in the school, and thereby gave the students maximum opportunities to learn and to grow". Fr Kuruville's batch-mate and colleague in AKJM, Fr Mathew Kannadan, writes: "Fr Kuruville was very creative. He plans a lot at night. The class leaders were trained to supervise the class in the absence of the teachers. Kuruville is a very generous person. He is a pioneer in many things". Fr M. M. Thomas, Kuruville's senior colleague in Loyola School, writes: "... a scholar and educator par excellence, a resourceful visionary with no pretensions, an indefatigable advocate of the Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm, music and sports aficionado, and above all a lovable human being with a heart larger than any of the institutions he served". Fr Joseph Edassery, Kuruville's colleague notes: "He was a person who would dream of greater things for the development of Loyola School. He was able to visualize new ways of empowering the students... In spearheading this mega project [of the indoor stadium] what was foremost in his mind was the integral development of the students and thus enabling them to excel in their studies as well as in extra-curricular activities". Fr Toby Joseph, now on the staff of Loyola School, says: "He was perceived among the staff as a priest who witnessed to Christ and Christianity in Loyola."

Fr Kuruville's Superior in Guyana, Fr Dermot Preston says about a discussion he had with Kuruville about his next assignment: "...he would hold his hand

up in a characteristic silencing fashion and say to me – always enunciating very clearly! – ‘Dermot, I am an obedient Jesuit. You tell me where you want me to go, and I will go there and do my best’”. And Fr Adolfo Nicholas, the Superior General of the Society at the Golden Jubilee of Fr Kuruvila’s religious life wrote: “Applying your innovative ideas, always in consultation with the staff, you ushered in new methods and approaches with a lot of interaction between the teacher and the student, encouraging and honoring the students, enhancing the parents-teachers relationship which paid dividends in the overall development of the students. Your love for the poor found expression in cultivating social consciousness in the students, encouraging them to help the poor and disadvantaged students.... You consider nothing a daunting task for the love Christ and for the sake of the Gospel.”

I end this write-up on a personal note. I have not worked with Kuruvila, but have noticed him well. In his eyes behind the rather thick glasses, in his face and in his person there was an innocence, genuineness - and a certain vulnerability which found expression as a mild stammer, a hesitation. Fr Kuruvila’s superior in Guyana, Fr Dermot

Preston writes that when they took the body from the mortuary, “Kuru’s face had relaxed into a dignified, patrician calm”. We do not want to think in terms of patrician and plebian, but Fr Preston has a point: there was something truly dignified and noble about Kuruvila. Fr M. M. Thomas says that Loyola School was Kuruvila’s ‘first love’. It was in Loyola that he learned the rudiments of the ministry of Jesuit education. It was around Loyola that for years he had woven his dreams of a Jesuit school worthy of the modern Society of Jesus and the modern Kerala. I was aware of all that. And so it was with much reluctance that in 1986 I, as Provincial, asked him to accept a transfer to AKJM - from the premier school in the capital city to a rural school struggling to find its identity and moorings. I knew that the proposal would wring his heart. It did. He expressed it with his characteristic restraint. And yet he went. As far as I could make out he kept no ill feelings towards me. And what great performance he offered in AKJM. With humility and respect I would say: in the life of Kuruvila the grain of wheat fell to the earth and died and bore much fruit.
