New Province Decreed: On 26 November 2010 on the Feast of St. John Berchmans, Father General approved the Decree to officially unite the Chicago Province and the Detroit Province into a

single apostolic entity, now known as the Chicago-Detroit Province (CDT). The new Chicago-Detroit Province officially took effect on 1 January 2011. Father Timothy P. Kesicki is Provincial of the new Province.

SEMINAR ON FR SEBASTIAN KAPPEN

A one day national seminar on Fr Kappen's contributions was organized by the Chair of Christianity, Mangalore University in association with the Social Justice Forum and CPCI India at Mangalore on 23rd November. A large gathering of priests, lay people, nuns, seminarians and others attended. It was a very enlightening and enthusing event. Two Jesuits presented papers along with other priests. I was the only Kerala Jesuit present. However, Fr Sebastian Painadath was acknowledged greatly for his contribution to the organization of the Seminar. I presented a paper on Kappen's reflections on Spirituality: 'Spirituality in the New Age of Colonization—A Critical Response to Fr Kappen's Thoughts.'

Fr Sebastian Kappen, of the Kerala Jesuit Province, a well-known theologian, was a pioneer thinker and a social activist who combined the spirituality

of Jesus with Marxian thought. He paved the way for the dialogue between the Christian world and secular ideologies. He lived, reflected and struggled in his mission with youth, both in University and among common people and intellectuals and professionals. Reminiscing his association with Fr Kappen from childhood, Dr Michael Tharakan, Vice-Chancellor, Kannur University, enthralled the audience. All the presentations maintained a high quality of theological depth and activist orientation. Dr John Fernandez, Head, Chair of Christianity, Shanti Kiran, Mangalore was the main organizer of the Seminar.

FROM TAIWAN

My travel to Hong Kong to apply for a Chinese Visa was looked upon with great expectations, as it could affect the future of the International regents in Taiwan. The Missionary Visa to Taiwan made it impossible for us to hide the fact that we are missionaries in Taiwan. The Chinese authorities for the second time rejected the application clearly stating that I am a missionary in Taiwan. Now the Chinese Government knows everything about me. In a way it gives me lot of freedom as I do not have to "play hide and seek" with them any longer. Even though I could not go to Communist China, I had the rare opportunity to interact with Chinese priests and religious who came to attend the Ignatian Symposium. It was an unexpected Christmas gift to me. They were very happy to meet an Indian who can speak and write

in Chinese. The Symposium (The Ricci Legacy: Finding God in Cultures) explored inculturation of various facets of Ignatian spirituality in different environments, including India, with a special emphasis on personal experience.

Back in Taiwan, I am involved with a youth group while continuing my studies in Chinese language. Just before going to Hong Kong, I had the opportunity to be part of a 3-day youth activity, the participants being non-Christian students from a Jesuit institution. I was responsible for the initial sessions which included teaching non-Christians "how to pray" in Chinese. I used the Yoga exercises, which I learned in my Novitiate to prepare them for prayer. This was appreciated by many. The whole process of attempting to go to China reminds us that we experience powerlessness in frontier ministry. The experience of powerlessness helps us to trust in God more deeply than ever before. As we hopefully wait for a better future, let us pray for each other! I remember you all in this New Year!
