From the Provincial's desk

My dear friends in the Lord,
I write these few lines as we are concluding the JCSA in Ranchi. It has been a wonderful experience for me to become aware of the varieties of our Jesuit involvement in the Assistancy and to be part of the deliberations.

You will soon be hearing from the president of JCSA regarding the closure of the REGE-II process and the various efforts in the Assistancy to develop a spirituality of care with the flavour of the Gospel. At this juncture of our Jesuit involvement in the Assistancy, it was quite apt that the JCSA took place in Ranchi after a gap of 33 years. The socio-political scenario of Jharkhand reflects what we are all experiencing in varying degrees wherever we are placed. It can be summed up in the poignant question once asked by a parent of a school to a Jesuit Principal in Dumka. "Why are you educating these Adivasis? They do not deserve it." The Adivasis and the poor, beyond the caste hierarchy, are supposed to serve the privileged. Such a mind-set coupled with the dangerous mix of religion, politics and corporate interests have vitiated the atmosphere in the country. We should not think that we in Kerala can remain insulated.

Let our Jesuit tradition of commitment to the poor enthuse us to move forward courageously.

IGNATIAN YEAR AND CONGREGATION OF PROCURATORS

Fr General, in his circular dated Sept 27, 2019, has announced the **Ignatian Year** to commemorate the conversion of Ignatius while convalescing at Loyola after the battle of Pamplona. The Ignatian Year will open on May 20, 2021 (anniversary of the injury at Pamplona), and will conclude on July 31, 2022. The centre of the Ignatian Year will fall on March 12, 2019, the 4th centenary of the canonization of St Ignatius with St Francis Xavier.

The same circular mentions Fr General's intention to convoke the **71st Congregation of Procurators** in the normal way. This will take place in Loyola (Spain), May 16-22, 2022. He will officially convoke the Congregation of Procurators on January 15, 2021.

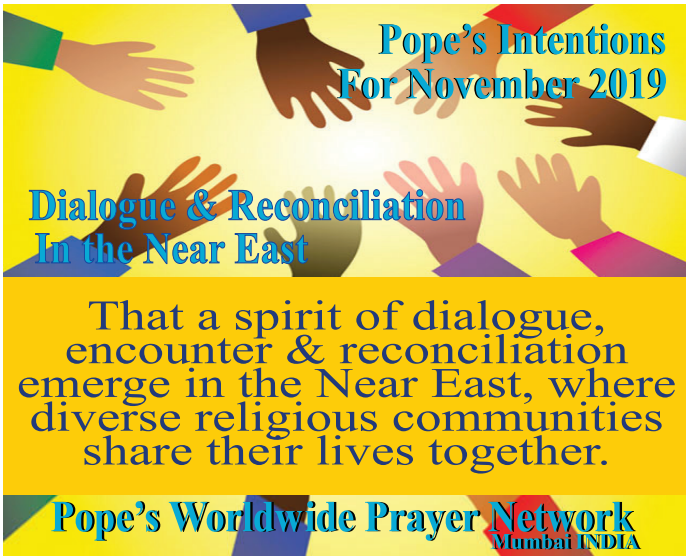

We recommend them for all our institutions.

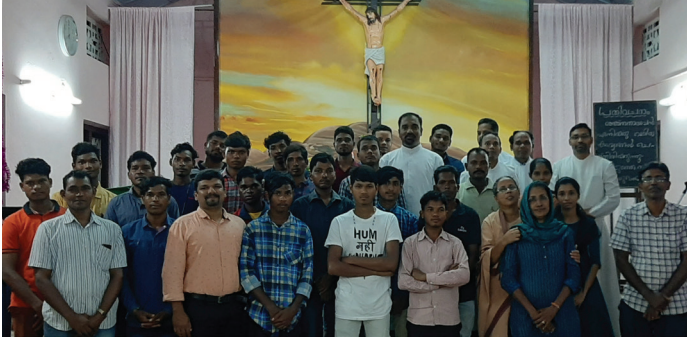
LOYOLA, MUKUNDARA

NATIONAL SEMINAR IN HONOUR OF FR SEBASTIAN KAPPEN



A two-day National Seminar was organized on 11-12 October 2019 at Renewal Centre, Ernakulam to mark the 25th death anniversary of **Fr Sebastian Kappen** (1924-1993). The theme of the seminar was *The Emergence of Fascist Tendencies in India:*

The Relevance of Kappen's Counter-Cultural Perspectives. Prominent academicians, cultural leaders and researchers participated and presented scholarly papers. The seminar was inaugurated by Prof. M.K. Sanu and presided over by **Fr E.P. Mathew**, Provincial. Prof Sanu highlighted the growing fascist tendencies that affect deeply our everyday life, and cautioned about the unhealthy nexus between the beaurocracy, politicians and religious leaders which degrade democracy and lead to the violation of our fundamental rights. Prof. Shiv Visvanathan of Jindal Global University, Haryana, delivered the keynote address. He termed the present situation in the country as dangerous, and said that it can be dealt with only by moral principles and relying on the values of the Constitution.

Those who addressed the gathering or made presentations include Dr K. Babu Joseph, Prof. Sarah Joseph, Dayabai, Fr Paul Thelakkattu, Mr Binoy Viswam, MP, Prof. Michael Tharakan, Mr. Civic Chandran, Dr Sunil P Ilayidom, Fr John Chathanattu, SJ and others. Ms Mercy Kappen, Director, Visthar Academy of Justice and Peace, Bangalore, shared her personal reflections on Kappen. The proposal to bring out the collected works of Kappen in a single volume was welcomed by all. The seminar was jointly organized by Loyola Institute of Peace and International Relations (LIPI), Kochi, Arnos Padiri Academy, Velur, Sameeksha Research Centre, Kalady and Ezhuthu Magazine, with the support of Kerala Jesuit Province. **Fr Binoy Pichalakkatu, SJ**, Director of LIPI, was the Coordinator of the seminar.
