My Dear Friends in the Lord,

It is possible that we quite often mix up our understanding of authority and power in our lives. Authority emerges from legitimacy that has spiritual or temporal basis. It enables us to exert influence and make decisions. Power connotes ability to influence or control the behaviour and actions of others. There are many factors that contribute legitimacy to our life-mission as Jesuits. The way we follow up our call reflecting the rootedness of our life in the Lord, the commitment that we manifest in our ministries are all factors that enhance legitimacy and in turn increase our credibility. Unlike authority, power always need not be legitimate. In today's world everyone desires the exercise of crude power. If we do not discern carefully, the legitimising factors can be used as means to exercise crude power.

As a Province we will be examining our rootedness in the *examen* that we will be conducting through the zonal gathering scheduled for the three Saturdays beginning on Saturday 16th September in Christ Hall, Saturday 23rd September in Ernakulam, and Saturday 30th September in Trivandrum. May we continuously intercede through the intercession of Our Lady of good health whose Feast we celebrate on 8th September. May the mother of Our Lord, the powerless one yet filled with authority, intercede for all of us.
