#### **LOYOLA COLLEGE OF SOCIAL SCIENCES**

The academic year 2025–26 at Loyola College of Social Sciences officially came to a close on 31st March. Our students have since dispersed for their internships and summer break, marking both a pause and a transition into new learning spaces. Meanwhile, the admission process for the forthcoming academic year is progressing steadily. This year, we introduced an entrance examination for the FYUGP, with the first phase conducted on 18th April across three centres—Ernakulam, Kanjirappally, and Thiruvananthapuram. We extend our sincere gratitude to **Fr Augustine Peedikamalayil** and **Fr Binoy Pichalakkattu** for their generous support in facilitating the examinations at Kanjirappally and Ernakulam, respectively.

The entrance examinations for the PG programmes were held on 2nd May at Calicut, Ernakulam, and Thiruvananthapuram. We are equally grateful to **Fr Roy Kuzhimannil** and **Fr Binoy Pichalakkattu** for coordinating and supporting the process at Calicut and Ernakulam. A significant highlight of this academic cycle was the introduction of the five-day residential immersion initiative for FYUGP students—the Summer Transformative Experiential Programme (STEP). Conducted in four batches from 16th April to 1st May, STEP brought together all our first-year students in a deeply engaging learning experience. The programme was thoughtfully designed and coordinated by Dr Nat, with the dedicated support of the DDI team, CODE fellows, and the FYUGP faculty members. The feedback received from students across batches has been profoundly encouraging. Many shared that the experience not only touched their hearts but also reshaped their perspectives in meaningful and lasting ways—affirming STEP as a transformative beginning to their academic journey at Loyola.

#### **LOYOLA SCHOOL**

The highlight of the month was the Externship Programme conducted for our Grade XI students across 53 centres. More than 400 students were privileged to participate in this unique exposure initiative, designed to help them understand work culture, professional environments, and the rhythm of daily life in various careers. Our

students gained firsthand experience in hospitals, hotels, IT firms, media centres, the zoo, police departments, courts, and more. This enriching programme was a collaborative venture of LOBA, PTA, and our dedicated teachers, reflecting the strength of our community partnership. We are also proud to share the outstanding results of the board examinations—CBSE Class X, ICSE Class X, and ISC Class XII. Our students have excelled with remarkable performances, with a majority securing distinction marks. They have made us truly proud, and their success stands as a testament to their hard work, perseverance, and the committed guidance of our teachers. Two of our ICSE students and two of our ISC students are expected to secure national Ranks. Loyola School made headlines in JEE MAINS Session II. Master Kishan Sivadas secured the fourth rank in Kerala state, and five of our students scored above the 99 percentage at the All-India level.

Adding to the vibrancy of the month, our scholastics—**David, Joffin, Alan, Cicil, and Babatto**—organised a Social Awareness and Leadership Programme for Grade X students. The camp was deeply appreciated and left a lasting impact on the participants. We also conducted a theatre workshop for our high school students, nurturing creativity and self-expression. Even during the summer vacation, the campus continues to be alive with activity. Coaching programmes in football, cricket, basketball, swimming, chess, dance, drawing, and robotics are progressing in full swing. The school remains vibrant, dynamic, and full of energy. As we look ahead, we are preparing to begin the new academic year with renewed enthusiasm, fresh ideas, and meaningful changes. 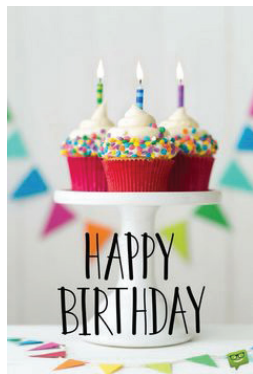

# Obituary

There are some lives that speak loudly through words, and there are others that speak gently through love, silence, and presence. Fr Jose Kadankavil belonged to the latter—quiet yet profound, simple yet deeply impactful. Like St. Joseph, he lived a life that did not seek attention, but radiated care, protection, and unwavering love.

Born on 26 July 1949 in Thudanganad, Idukki, Fr Jose came from a noble family of late Joseph and Anna, rooted in faith and simplicity. He completed his primary and secondary education at St. Thomas School, Thudanganad, and pursued his pre-degree and B.A. in Economics at St. Berchman's College, Changanacherry. Responding to God's call, he entered the Society of Jesus on 13 July 1971. He underwent his novitiate at Christ Hall, Calicut, and Newman Hall, Ahmedabad, and took his first vows in 1973. His formation continued with Juniorate at XTTI, Patna, Philosophy at Shembaganur, and Regency at St. Michael's, Cannanore, and St. Joseph's, Kozhikode. He also completed an ITI course at Pius X ITI, Edathua, before pursuing his theological studies at Vidyajyoti, Delhi. He was ordained a priest on 03 May 1984 at St. Thomas Church, Thudanganad, and later completed his tertianship at Hazaribagh, making his final commitment in the Society on 22 April 1991.

His long and faithful service in the Society of Jesus took him through various ministries. He began as Assistant Parish Priest at Mariapuram, served at Beach Blossom, SRC, Calicut, and later as Assistant Director and Director of Loyola Social Work, Poovar. He also carried out pastoral ministry in the Newark Archdiocese, USA, before returning to serve as Director of SRC, Calicut. Over the years, he ministered in several parishes—as Assistant Vicar, Parish Priest, and Vicar in places like Kallikad, Chemboor, and Malaparamba. He also served at Loyola Sadan and Loyola School, Poozhanad, and later as Parish Priest at Kottakkal. His mission extended abroad again to the Diocese of Waterford and Lismore, Ireland, and on his return, he continued his priestly service at Cheruvaikal, Trivandrum and later in spiritual ministry and as Bursar at AKJM School, Kanjirappally. In his later years, he moved to Christ Hall, Kozhikode, for rest and treatment.

To many, he was a devoted Jesuit priest. But to me, he was a gentle presence and a deeply saintly person. I had the privilege of living with him at Christ Hall during my college studies, when he was the SRC Director. Those were formative years for me, and his life—more than his words—became a silent lesson.

Later, when I was at AKJM School, Kanjirappally, he served as the bursar, and once again I experienced his simplicity and goodness. Fr Jose had a rare and beautiful quality—he made people feel safe and cared for. Like St. Joseph, he protected without possessing, guided without controlling, and loved without expecting anything in return. He was never imposing, never demanding; yet his very presence commanded respect. There was a certain serenity about him that calmed situations and brought people together.

In a world that often values noise, speed, and visibility, Fr Jose chose the hidden path of humility. His life reminded me that greatness in God's eyes is often found in the unnoticed, the quiet, and the faithful.

Even in his later years, when he moved to Christ Hall, Kozhikode, for rest and treatment, his witness did not diminish. If anything, it became more powerful. His patience in suffering, his acceptance, and his surrender spoke volumes. He continued to preach—without words—the beauty of a life rooted in God.

Today, as I remember him, I do feel a sense of loss. But more than that, I feel deep gratitude. I thank God for the gift of knowing him, living with him, and learning from him. Lives like his do not fade away; they quietly remain within us, shaping us, guiding us, and reminding us of what truly matters.

Fr Jose Kadankavil will remain in our hearts as a gentle shepherd, a faithful Jesuit, and a loving and lovable human being. His silence spoke, his life inspired, and his memory will continue to bless us.
